Junior Judges & Paraders

In 2024, the young judging & junior parading will be held on Tuesday 21 May commencing at 3:00 pm.

The Miles & District competitions will be held prior to the Southwest Regional Competitions

There is no entry fee for this competition

Nominations are open to persons under 25 years of age on May 1 2024

The local competition for Paraders will commence at 3:00 pm. If participants wish to progress to regional competitions, they **MUST** wear an appropriate dust coat or uniform. The winner/s of the local competition need to be 15 years old if they wish to compete in the regional competitions.

Classes will be split as necessary once nominations are received, to allow for fairer competition, at the chief stewards discretion.

Competitors under the age of 18 are required to get written parental / guardian permission before competing. (there is a section on the form)

Stud Beef Cattle

CONDITIONS: exhibitors please note the following conditions apply to all classes

ALL ENTRIES ARE TO BE COMPLETED THROUGH SHOWDAY ONLINE – www.showday.online

FEES: \$5 per animal per class \$10 Ground Improvement Fee (one off)

- 1 All persons working with cattle that are being shown must wear appropriate footwear – NO THONGS
- 2 All exhibitors who participate in the show ring must wear dust jackets, society approved uniforms or be neatly attired at all times when their animal is presented to the judge
- 3 No bulls over 42 months are permitted to be shown
- 4 All show cattle must be tick free to enter the showgrounds
- 5 All exhibits to be registered with a recognised stud beef society
- 6 All exhibits must be on the showgrounds no later than 8:00 am on Tuesday 21 May
- 7 No stud beef cattle will be admitted to the grounds unless thoroughly tractable
- 8 All cattle must be bona fide property of the exhibitor three months prior to the show
- 9 Whilst all reasonable care is taken, the society cannot accept any losses, damages, or injury to or by any livestock, exhibits, equipment, vehicles or any other property
- 10 Age of all cattle to be may 1 2024 (see guide)
- 11 All bulls 14 months and over MUST have a nose ring and be led by both a halter and nose ring
- 12 Bulls under 14 months and ALL FEMALES must have a nose ring or grip
- 13 Cattle must not be introduced if they are from a property or herd in which Johnes' disease has been known or suspected to exist during the five year period prior to the show
- 14 All exhibitors to have public liability insurance and to have some endorsed for travelling to shows
- 15 And exhibitors / competitors intending to bring electrical equipment to the showgrounds will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with residual current protection and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected by a licenced electrical contractor and is currently tagged. The use of double adaptors is prohibited and all power boards must be tested and tagged
- 16 Risks identified by exhibitors / competitors will be eliminated or controlled by the exhibitor / competitor and particular attention will be paid to ensure public safety and safety of other exhibitors / competitors
- 17 It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to ensure that the leaders of their stock in judging rings and parades are capable of exercising control over the animal in their care
- 18 Each exhibitor / competitor will assess the risk to themselves, staff, volunteers, family, other exhibitors, show stewards, show visitors and any person foreseeable affected by the presentation of their exhibit
- 19 The exhibitors / competitors are required to ensure that they are and all persons under their direction or control comply with all requirements of the workplace health and safety act 1995 and the society holds each exhibitor responsible to discharge its obligations to provide and maintain a safe place and system of work during occupation by the exhibitor / competitor of any area of the showgrounds
- 20 Stewards have the right to remove any animal from the judging ring if that animal is a danger to the safety of the public
- 21 No dispute will be considered whilst the event is in progress. Protest is to be lodged in writing within 30 minutes after the class in dispute is completed and must be handed to the show secretary accompanied by a fee of \$50. The three member dispute committee will consist of the stewards and their decision is final
- 22 All cattle must be accompanied by a DPI travel permit endorsed with treatments performed (if necessary) and an owner waybill
- 23 It is the responsibility of the owner or person in charge of the stock to ensure that the cattle tick requirements (where necessary) have been fulfilled in regard to the entry treatments. Persons not fulfilling the requirements will be refused entry to the showgrounds
- 24 It is the responsibility of the owner or person in charge of the stock to contact the nearest Department of Primary Industry Stock Inspector to arrange for treatment (where necessary) of their stock according to the statutory requirements
- 25 It is forbidden to administer any prohibited drug or cause on to be administered in any way whatsoever
- 26 A prohibited drug means any substance originating externally to the animal (whether endogenous to the animal) capable of affecting the performance or behaviour of any animal by its action upon central or peripheral nervous system, the cardiovascular system, the respiratory system, the alimentary system, the Musculo-skeletal system or the uro-genital system and shall include analgesics, anti-histamines, anti-inflammatory agents, blood coagulants, diuretics, hormones and their synthetic counterparts, cortico-steroids, anabolic steroids, local anaesthetics, muscle relaxants and tranquilizers and vitamins.
- 27 Any exhibit which has been brought to the showgrounds and is found to have had administered to it any prohibited drugs as defined above may, without any prejudice to any other action which may be taken in respect of the matter, be debarred by the show stewards from competing in any event for which it had been entered
- 28 No drug, hormone or tranquilizer shall be administered to any animal exhibit except under the direction of the society's veterinary surgeon who will advise the stewards if in their opinion such drug, hormone or tranquilizer is likely to have an effect upon the animal which would be material to its chances of being awarded a prize in such case the stewards may debar the animal from competing. In prime cattle, growth promotion substance is permitted
- 29 A show steward may at any time direct the society's veterinary surgeon to take a sample of blood, saliva or urine from an exhibit for testing
- 30 SAFETY FIRST – animals must have leads attached to rings / grips when being lead around cattle section

SAFETY FIRST

- ❖ Animals over 14 months – must have leads attached to nose rings / grips when being lead around the cattle section (See regulations 11 & 12)
- ❖ Animals – collars are to be used in all stalls
- ❖ Humans – under WH&S, all persons must wear enclosed shoes whilst in designated animal areas – NO THONGS
